A Letter From Pastor Ken

In 2017, our emphasis was for each individual and our church to MOVE! Martin Luther King, Jr., once said, "If you can't fly, run. If you can't run, walk. If you can't walk, crawl, but whatever you do you have to keep moving forward." This past year we did "move forward" and God did some amazing things...

MOVE Up: In order to move up, we have to grow up. That happens when we develop the individual disciplines that facilitate personal spiritual growth. Disciplines of reading the Scriptures, prayer, and connecting with a Life Group. Many took first-time steps to advance their relationship with Jesus through daily time with him and weekly time with others in a group.

MOVE Out: In order to move out, we have to go out. In the last 12 months, hundreds have been a part of making a difference across the street and around the world. Our July Takin' It To the Schools saw 300+ involved in five Roanoke Valley Schools for a workday. Teams went to prisons, Baltimore, West Virginia, Nepal, India, Guatemala, Zambia, Kyrgyzstan, and Lebanon.

MOVE Down: A move from self-serving to self-sacrificing. Last summer, we looked at the Gospel of Mark and observed how Jesus lived. We live in a culture that is consumed with our plans and agenda. Jesus was and is a contrast to culture. His whole life revolved around the mission. "...the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45) As we look to Jesus and study His life, it impacts both our attitudes and actions.

MOVE In: A move to new spaces for new faces. Each of our three campuses had changes in our facilities that allow for greater impact in our community. North Campus moved forward with remodeling existing space so that a booming children's ministry could expand. Southwest Campus moved from Cave Spring Middle School to Faith Christian School for more conducive worship services and children's ministries. Salem Campus moved into a new building for growing children and student ministries.

As you look through the 2017 Annual Report, take a few moments to reflect on all that God has done over the last year. We have a lot to be thankful for. Celebrate what God has done as we follow Jesus and point others to Him.

What's on the horizon for FCC? For decades churches have been known for what they are against. Certainly, we are against things like sin and social injustice. But often people hear only what we're against. What if they knew what we are FOR? Beginning this year, we want people to know that we are FOR THE ROANOKE VALLEY!


Kids Life classrooms and explored creative ways to best utilize the space God has blessed us with.




No Matter What

Fall Fest






